Thank you for your interest in volunteering with Central Energy Trust Wildbase Recovery. Volunteering is a rich and rewarding way to contribute to a cause you care about, and we have a variety of roles for different skills and experiences.

Central Energy Trust Wildbase Recovery is a world class rehabilitation centre for native wildlife recovering from illness or injury. The centre provides shelter and care to a range of native wildlife during their recovery after treatment at Massey University's Wildbase Hospital.

The centre is made up of fourteen specially designed rehabilitation aviaries for patients, a walkthrough aviary housing tuatara and a variety of resident native birds, two breeding aviaries for the endangered whio (blue duck) and pāteke

(brown teal), a support facility for vet care, and the Powerco Education Centre. Every animal at Central Energy Trust Wildbase Recovery is an ambassador for their species and the perils facing them in the wild.

We provide the community with a conservation education experience like no other. Locals, visitors, schools and community organisations have the opportunity to see conservation in action - and learn how they can make a difference to the future of New Zealand's native wildlife.



WHAT DOES VOLUNTEERING AT CENTRAL ENERGY TRUST WILDBASE RECOVERY LOOK LIKE?

Volunteers play an important part in the everyday running of Central Energy Trust Wildbase Recovery. There is a weekend and weekday roster for volunteers in several different roles including: visitor hosts, animal behaviour monitoring, food preparation for animals, pest control, and general upkeep and cleaning.

From telling the stories of current and past patients, to sharing conservation education messages, to keeping our wildlife safe and healthy - there's a role for everyone.

We offer in depth training for our volunteers, and ask that you make a commitment for at least six months. Volunteers must be 16 years of age or over, and written parental permission is required for those who are under 18.

If you'd like to volunteer, please complete an application form and we'll be in touch to set up an brief interview. You will be required to complete the New Zealand police vetting process, and adhere to the Central Energy Trust Wildbase Recovery Health and Safety protocols.

FRONT OF HOUSE ROLES

Visitor Host

Visitor Hosts play an integral role in our centre. During opening hours Visitor Hosts are stationed around the centre providing general information and guidance to the public. Light cleaning such as surface wiping in the Powerco Education Centre or path sweeping is also a part of this role as required.

Tour Guide

A tour guide is a great opportunity to share the story of CET Wildbase Recovery and its patient journeys. For approximately one hour, you can guide a small group of friendly and appreciative visitors around the centre introducing our residents and discussing our purpose.

BACK OF HOUSE ROLES

Food preparation

Food preparation is a daily task that requires chopping, measuring and allocating appropriate food for all birds.

Enrichment for animals

Volunteers can help create an enriching environment for our animals by making toys and devices from natural materials.

General upkeep and cleaning

General cleaning and light maintenance is an important part of daily roles. This is done across the facility.

Pest Control

To keep our wildlife safe, trained volunteers will be responsible for the monthly checking and rebaiting of traps.

Multi-site

Volunteers can preform roles across both Wildbase Recovery and the Victoria Esplanade exotic aviaries.

Please note that volunteers will not be involved in any handling or direct contact with the animals at the centre.

MEDICAL CONDITIONS

IMMUNITY

To protect your health, some medical conditions need to be disclosed before working within aviaries.

People with the following conditions are more susceptible to infection from close contact with bird enclosures; pregnancy, heart conditions, immunosuppressive disorders caused by such things as HIV, chemotherapy and lupus, or any other condition that lowers immunity.

We recommend that if you have any of these conditions you **only** apply for the Visitor Host role.

PHYSICAL
